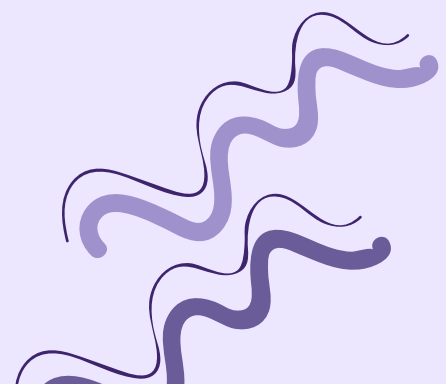


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INTRODUCTION

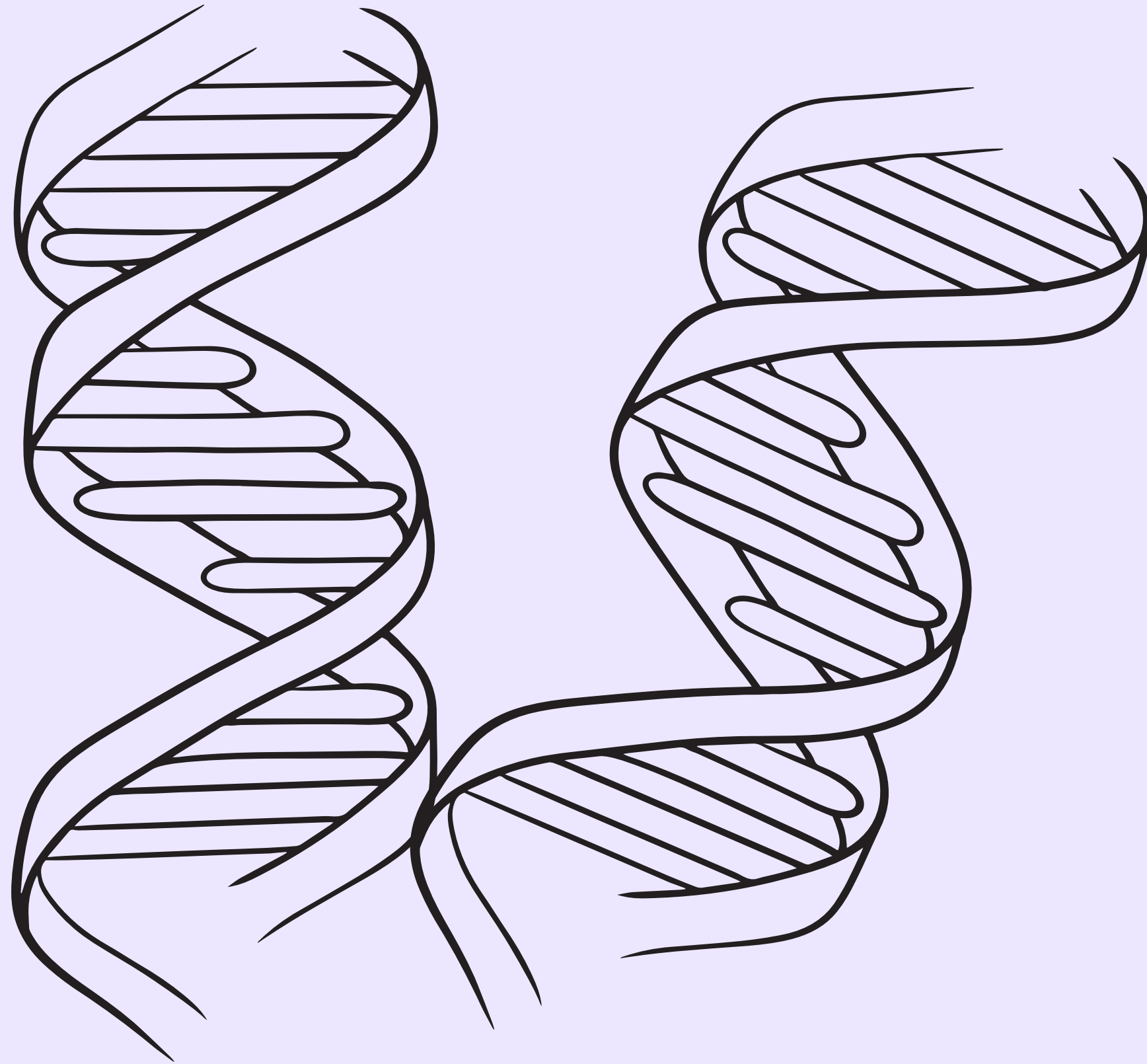
This is a collaboration writing project with two other technical writers. The goal of this project is to learn more about formatting a style guide and practice using technical writing techniques.
